**2. Chair Welcome/Remarks**

CAPT Dellapenna, EHOPAC Chair, welcomed all those in attendance to the meeting. This is typically our largest meeting of the year as far as officers who can attend the meeting. CAPT Dellapenna thanked everyone for taking the time to attend and described the meeting format.

**3. Billet Transformation Update** – CAPT Byron Bailey –The billet collection system was launched on June 19<sup>th</sup> in the Therapist Category. About 70% of the Therapists have selected their title (first step) and many have completed the second step. The Nurse Category will be launched in the next week or so. The next group of categories to be launched will be the Engineer, EHO, and Pharmacist Categories. It is anticipated that this group will be launched approximately mid-July. All three categories were sent their current standard billets today for one last review to ensure they are in order before launch. CAPT Bailey also recommended that categories utilize a model started by the Therapist Category (Rapid Responders for billet questions). The Therapists chosen Rapid Responder Role are the two people who were instrumental in the design of the billets. CAPT Bailey is answering process related questions and the Therapist Rapid Responders are answering questions specific to the category billets. There are twenty-two standard billet titles for EHOs along with position descriptions.

**4. Chief Professional Officer Report** – CAPT Welch

- EHO Readiness – CAPT Welch expressed his appreciation for the work everyone has done to maintain our Category’s readiness status. The EHO Category Readiness Status is very good overall and in comparison to the other categories.
- Billet Transformation – CAPT Welch reviewed key points from CAPT Bailey’s presentation.
- COSTEPs & CADs – Assignments for this summer did not work out as well as we thought it would. We have brought COSTEPs on as Civil Service Externs. We lost a few COSTEPs through that process. OCCO is working on call to duty dates for COSTEPs as well as others. They have completed call to duty for the first 29 people (highest priority). They were the individuals who had their orders cut and were then rescinded with the passage of the Health Care Reform Act. COSTEPs are the second level priority group and include about

170 individuals. He estimated CAD for COSTEPs sometime during the month of June. They will be CAD to the Ready Reserve. In the future, the CADs will be in the Regular Corps. For the EHOs, that means that our appointment standards formerly used to call individuals to duty in the Reserve Corps will now be used to call individuals to active duty in the Regular Corps. There is no longer a ceiling on the number of Regular Corps Officers we can have in the US PHS. This is one reason for the delay of CAD.

- Ready Reserve – No policies or guidelines were in place for a Ready Reserve component. Those are being developed now along with a Strategic Plan for what the Ready Reserve is going to look like. It is designed to add additional Commissioned Corps personnel who would be available on short notice similar to what the other Uniformed Services have in place. The plan is to bring on 200 officers per year over the next five years so there would be 1,000 Ready Reserve Officers in place. These officers would be available to assist with regular assignments, regular duties, or emergency response positions if needed. These will be short tours of 30 to 120 days.
- Regular Corps CAD – We are still working on a process to accomplish this in a short amount of time.

## 5. Liaison Reports

- COA Board – CAPT Wendy Fanaselle – There have been some major developments that came about following the completion of the 45th Annual COA/COF Scientific Symposium. The first development is Senator Daniel Akaka, Chairman of the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee, introduced legislation S.3447 Titled “Post 9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Improvements Act of 2010”. (Complete text of the bill can be found at: <http://thomas.loc.gov/cgi-bin/query/z?c111:S.3447>: This is a long awaited technical correction bill for the Post 9/11 GI Bill. Sen. Akaka’s bill adds the transferability of the Post 9/11 GI Bill Education Entitlement to family members of USPHS and NOAA Commissioned Corps Officers. While this is the first step in a long process, it is a substantial achievement for COA. The House Veterans Affairs Committee was generally sympathetic to our issue and the bill is expected to go through. The second development is that the President signed the letter delegating authority to the Secretary of DHHS to commission 457 Officer Candidates. This breaks the log-jam of the call to active duty issue that has existed since March 23, 2010. The COA was instrumental in orchestrating significant congressional pressure on the Department, OMB, and the White House over this issue. In addition, the COA/COF Scientific Symposium held last week was a success despite limited support for attendance by the Department. A number of officers financed their own travel to the Symposium as a result. There were 950 attendees (800-825 Officers & the rest were Students).

6. **Treasurer’s Report** – CAPT Hall - Current balance in our account held by COA is \$2873.66.

## 7. OPDIV/Agency Reports

- CDR Kates – OS/ASPR – Oil Spill: Monitoring role through the Secretary's Operation Center. A request was received from the state to post a team (Mobile Medical Unit) in Louisiana. The concern was that there could be underserved populations, displaced workers and others that didn't have access to care due to the oil spill response. On Memorial Day a small medical unit was deployed. OS/ASPR worked with the Louisiana Department of Health & Hospitals to place the unit in Venice, LA (one of the major BP Staging Areas). The initial response is to provide a stop-gap. The hope is to provide a stop-gap until the local infrastructure and economy can provide needed services.
- LCDR Unthank – USCG – The Coast Guard has a significant role in the oil spill response effort. There is a large contingency of active duty CG Officers & enlisted as well as PHS Environmental Health Officers currently involved in the response effort. The Coast Guard has 20 EHO positions with 5 vacancies and 4 of those staff unable to deploy for various reasons. Therefore, the Coast Guard has 11 EHOs on duty. Six of those are in Louisiana in Safety Officer or Industrial Hygiene roles deployed as part of the response. In addition, there is a small contingent of Industrial Hygienists going down to do air sampling to monitor the dispersant that is being used. EHOs are rotating on 30 day deployments. It is expected that all the PHS EHOs assigned to the Coast Guard will be deployed at some time during the response.
- Coast Guard – LCDR Unthank: Kudos to LCDR Jacob Wamsley who deployed to Haiti where he was embedded with security forces for 30+ days. Two officers presented recently at the AIHA conference. Currently USCG has five EHO vacancies; two have been filled and are part of the log jam at OCCO as a result of the passage of the Health Care Reform Act. Likely two more will be advertised in the near future.
- FDA – CDR Hargrave: Office of Regulatory Affairs Liaison sent out a request to all categories that the CV template include contact information on each page. The reason is that FDA has hired a number of new officers over the past few years. During the hiring process, when they need to contact the officer, if the first page is missing they disregard the applicant since they have no way to reach them. Therefore, there are Corps Officers who are missing out on job opportunities because of the CV template. In addition, when applying to the FDA, applicants should indicate that they are Commissioned Corps Officers in as many places as possible when applying for jobs on the USA Jobs website.
- FDA – CAPT Noska: FDA has been undergoing some reorganization over the last year particularly in the area of food. An Office of Foods was created within the Commissioner's Office along with Center for Food Safety and Applied Nutrition. The Office of Foods has established a new position entitled Chief Medical Officer Director of Outbreak and Response. The individual in this position will be the new leader for a Food Outbreak Team. This will include collaboration with CDC and state and local epidemiologists.

## 8. Subcommittee Reports

EHOPAC Charter and Bylaws have been reviewed, revised, updated, and approved by the EHOPAC and the Surgeon General's Office. New copies of both documents have been posted on the EHOPAC website.
- **Professional Image and Standards** – CAPT Noska for CDR McKernan – The subcommittee website has been updated and includes a listing of web links for the following topics: Environmental Health Officer Image and Standards; USPHS Uniform Suppliers; and Accreditations & Certifications.
- **Marketing & Recruitment/Associate Recruitment** –LCDR Freed – See attached report. This is one of the largest and busiest subcommittees.
- **Career Development** – CDR Johnson – The Career Development Subcommittee is gearing up for several initiatives including: annual work plan for the subcommittee; benchmarks; and counseling for officers who scored in the lowest quartile during the promotion process.
- **Mentoring & Orientation** – CAPT Gaunce – no report.
- **Information Technology** – LCDR Laco – Workgroups: Listserv; Web Site Content & Design; WebEx Support; and Liaison Workgroup.

The Data Team is looking at historical data and will interpret the data for use on the PAC website. They are hoping to include a timeline of historical items related to the category and the PAC.
